# BORDEAUX 2023

The 2023 Bordeaux En Primeur campaign is one of the earliest on record, a sign that the Bordeaux Châteaux need to sell some wine! The commercial environment for Bordeaux has changed since the market for Fine Wine in China came to a halt, and it was quite noticeable that there were far few buyers from Asia at the Union des Grands Crus tastings during the last week of April. There is also the added ingredient of very healthy yields in 2023 with the cellars full, a welcome change to previous smaller vintages.

The good news is that these changing times have brought welcome price reductions, so the Claret drinker has a lot to smile about! The biggest reductions come in the upper echelons of the Bordeaux hierarchy, with Chateaux Mouton-Rothschild and Lafite-Rothschild showing 37% and 31% reductions respectively. There are reductions across the board although it must be said that there is far less room for manoeuvre at the everyday drinking level. As a wine merchant, we are pleased to see a return to proper En Primeur pricing which gives the consumer a real incentive to buy.

The 2023 vintage certainly had its climatic challenges. Back in July, there were press reports that 90% of the crop had been destroyed by mildew, a result of the warm temperatures and frequent rains in June. The reality was that mildew had 'touched' 90% of the vineyards, but hey, never let the truth get in the way of sensationalising a story.

There is no denying that the early summer was a very challenging time and the vineyard teams worked their fingers to the bone fighting the mildew attacks. Merlot was worst affected and so we see lower percentages of this variety in many of the Left Bank wines.

By mid August the weather turned for the better. Temperatures soared and the heatwave remained throughout September. This wonderful period of weather in late summer was a godsend and a just reward for the trials and tribulations of May and June. It ensured that the grapes ripened and attained a very good phenolic ripeness too. Patience was required however, as the ripening period was uneven with picking dates varying from plot to plot. It was one of the longest harvests on record, starting in early September and continuing well into October.

Yields were very healthy in 2023, especially in the prestigious appellations, where the wealthy Grand Cru Classés are well equipped to deal with the challenging conditions. The average yield in St Julien was 52hl/ha with Pauillac and Saint-Estèphe similar. Only Margaux came up short with an average of 38hl/ha.

On the Left Bank, it is fair to describe the 2023 vintage as a heterogenous one – that is the traditional beauty of Bordeaux, with a more notable variation between Châteaux and appellations than in previous years. We tasted some outstanding wines that showed wonderful balance, a welcome restraint in alcohol (Gruaud Larose came in at 12.62% - and what an excellent wine it is.) and impressive fruit concentration, produced in a classic style. The tannin structures are very good, with many wines showing similar levels to the 2022 vintage, so they will age well too. Gone, it seems, are the days of Robert Parker inspired wines, and amen to that. This is certainly a vintage for the traditional claret drinker.

Turning to the Right Bank, we tasted some delicious Merlot and Cabernet Franc blends, with a greater balance and freshness than recent years, largely due to more normal yields. We particularly liked the wines of Pomerol and there are some exceptional value wines from Lalande de Pomerol and Montagne St Emilion.

In conclusion, the 2023 vintage was one of the most climatically challenging vintages in recent years. Despite such challenges, there are some truly fantastic wines, produced in a classic style with a core of concentrated, ripe fruits, beautifully crafted tannins and a delicious balancing freshness. Those wines that we have selected deserve their place and will offer great pleasure and, dare I say, good value!

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# WHY BUY EN PRIMEUR?

Historically, there are a number of reasons for buying 'En Primeur', the most obvious being that you are buying your wine at the initial release price from the Château. The wines of Bordeaux take many years to develop before they are ready to drink by which time they may not be commercially available, and even if they are the price becomes prohibitive.

Importantly, by buying En Primeur you can be sure of the provenance of your wine, knowing where and how it has been stored. When buying mature wine on the open market there is always the danger that it has been around the world, stored in variable conditions, which may cause damage to the wine.

Buying En Primeur needs careful judgement. Recent years have seen large increases in the value of certain wines, and in the low interest rate environment of the past ten years wine has been seen to be a good place to invest monies. However, this has resulted in release prices increasing, and now with interest rates returning to historic norms, investing in wine needs great consideration. We always say – 'We are wine merchants, not financial advisors!' We only advise what to buy from a drinking perspective.

We also advise you to purchase from a traditional, established wine merchant in whom you can place your trust. The House of Townend celebrates 118 years in the hands of the same family and we pride ourselves in giving personal, considered advice.

### Example

You purchase a case of 6 bottles for  $\pounds140.00$ .

When the wine arrives in the UK and you wish to remove it from bond, the following process is completed in order for this to happen. Charges will apply.

- Payment of VAT on initial purchase £28.00
- Duty payment including VAT at the current rate £19.24
- Total Duty and VAT £47.24

Therefore bringing the total cost of your case of wine to £187.23 or £31.20 a bottle.

You can then collect your wine from our Cellar Door, or we can arrange delivery (at your cost) to an address in the UK.



### **BORDEAUX BLANC**

### **PESSAC-LÉOGNAN BLANC**

Often overlooked for its white wines, Bordeaux actually offers some outstanding everyday drinking, with wines of great character, not just one-dimensional fruit. It is a great source of rich and creamy blends, yielding flavours and aromas of creme brûlée, baked apples, orange zest, figs and lemon butter.

Geographically Pessac-Léognan is a continuation to the south-east of Haut-Médoc. Many vineyards in the north have disappeared as the city of Bordeaux has extended outwards. The whole region was formerly known as Graves, but since 1996 it has been divided into two appellations, Pessac-Léognan and Graves. Pessac-Léognan is the most northerly and best part, where most of the Grands Crus are situated.

### Château Olivier Grand Cru Classé (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 80% Sauvignon Blanc, 70% Semillon

Classified for its red and white wines, Château Olivier is surrounded by forest that not only influences the property's micro-climate, but which has given it 8 hectares of prime vineyard, already in the Pessac-Léognan AOC.

This is a wonderfully balanced and citrus-laden Olivier, 80% Sauvignon and 20% Semillon, supported by 35% new oak and 10 months in barrel. Open and lush now, this will age for 5-10 years as the freshness of acidity underscores the ripe peach, dessert apple and mineral fruit.

### Château de Fieuzal Grand Cru Classé (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 60% Sauvignon Blanc, 40% Semillon

The Château was acquired in 2001 by Irish businessman and philanthropist, Lochlann Quinn, who has invested heavily whilst also increasing the vineyard holdings, to become one of the larger Classified Growths of the Pessac-Legnan Appellation. The 48ha of vines are split 39ha of red grapes (60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 33% Merlot, 4.5% Cabernet Franc and 2.5% Petit Verdot) and 9ha of white grapes (split equally between Semillon and Sauvignon Blanc).

This is one of the finest white wines of the 2023 vintage. Ripe peach skin, a touch of apricot and a streak of minerality and wet stone, this is a full bodied and zippy Pessac, benefiting from 40% new oak and 12 months in barrel.



### SAUTERNES

After a satisfying meal, what's better than a chilled glass of dessert wine with your favourite pudding? Especially from the world's finest dessert wine producing region.

Located to the south of Bordeaux this area is perfectly suited to dessert wine production due to the close proximity to the Garonne River where grapes often develop Botrytis Cinerea. This noble rot is a fungal rot that causes ripe grapes to shrivel under perfect conditions, reducing the moisture content of the grapes resulting in incredibly intense sweet wines.

### Château Liot (12x37.5cl) Grape Mix: 80% Sémillon, 15% Sauvignon Blanc, 5% Muscadelle

This 25-hectare property has been in the David family for several generations and is currently run by Jean-Gérard David. Although it is labelled Sauternes, it is actually situated on the Haut-Barsac plateau on typical red clay over limestone soils, in the commune of Barsac, next to Château Climens.

Aged in oak barrels for 12 months. A vibrant golden colour, the bouquet offers aromatic clarity and the palate is rich with concentrated pineapple, ripe apricot and juicy peach.



### **BORDEAUX & BORDEAUX SUPÉRIEUR**

### **BORDEAUX AND BORDEAUX SUPÉRIEUR**

This appellation covers an area of 51,000 hectares of which 44,000 hectares are devoted to the production of red wines. Maximum yields are 55hl/ha with alcohol levels of between 10% and 13% vol. There is a lot of sub-standard wine in this appellation; however, with careful (sometimes tedious) selection it is the home of some wonderful wines that are great value for money for everyday drinking.

The Bordeaux Supérieur appellation covers the same geographical area as Bordeaux AOC, however the wines are produced from older vines and released 12 months later than Bordeaux AOC. Again, there are some fantastic wines to be found at this level.

### Château Tour de Luchey, Bordeaux (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 80% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc

This 25ha Château, situated in Moulon, to the south of St Emilion, is owned and run by the Massé family. Fermented and aged in cement and stainless steel tanks, with 5% aged in oak barrels.

A rich and intense bouquet showing concentrated aromas of black fruits. The palate is dense, black cherry fruits dominate with a touch of dark chocolate lending a creamy feel to the wine and there is a crunchy acidity and freshness, all supported by super yielding tannins. This wine will offer great everyday drinking!

### Drink 2025 - 2027

#### Château d'Argadens, Bordeaux Supérieur (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 63% Merlot, 32% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Cabernet Franc

In 2002 this property, situated in Saint-André-du-Bois, 60km south of Bordeaux, was purchased by the Sichel family, owners of Château Angludet and co owner of Château Palmer. A major investment programme was undertaken. The vineyards were re-structured with increased plantation density, and the winery and ageing cellar re-built. The result? Well, this property now produces the very best wine you can kind find at this level. Its popularity in recent years has soared and is now one of our most popular drinking clarets.

The fruit is hand-harvested and fermented in large vats, then aged in 30% new French oak barrels for 14 months, receiving light fining and filtering prior to being bottled. Succulent, rich and round in style, the palate is full of cassis fruits with soft approachable tannins.

### **CRU BOURGEOIS**

### MÉDOC AND HAUT-MÉDOC

The Médoc AOC covers approximately 5,700 ha which constitutes 34.5% of the Médoc in total. The soils are gravel and clay-limestone with frequent areas of heavy, clay rich moisture, retentive soils.

Around the edges of the Médoc and between the specific communes lies the Haut-Médoc (Upper Médoc). It varies in quality from some of the finest wines, most notably Château La Lagune in Ludon in the south and Château Sociando-Mallet in the north, to the somewhat mediocre. In normal years, careful selection is required when choosing wines from the Haut-Médoc but value for money can be found here, which is hardly what Bordeaux is renowned for!

### Château Semonlon, Haut-Médoc (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 60% Merlot, 40% Cabernet Sauvignon

This property is located in Avensan, a small commune not far from Margaux. Its vineyards border those of Château Citran. Owned by the Dumora family, whose patrimony spans several generations, its 7 hectares are planted with 40% Cabernet Sauvignon and 60% Merlot, while the average age of the vines is 35 years. The soil is comprised of muddy gravel, large stones and small amounts of clay.

Olivier Dumora uses 1 and 2 year old barrels from Château Prieure-Lichine for the elevage of this wine that punches hard and is a great entry into the Haut-Medoc appellation. The bouquet offers a fabulous rich and raisined black fruit aroma with an overt freshness. The mouthfeel is dense with a crunchy black fruit compote and juicy balance, firm but yielding tannins and a touch of sandalwood on the finish. This wine offers supreme value.





### HAUT-MÉDOC

### Château Cissac, Haut-Medoc (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 34% Merlot, 8% Petit Verdot, 2% Malbec

Château Cissac belongs to the Vialard family, and its reputation was built on the tireless work of Louis Vialard, who established the wine's fame through the 1970s and 1980s. Situated in the northern-most Haut-Médoc appellation, this historic château dates from 1769. The soil in the vineyards is less diverse than in the Médoc, predominantly sandy, with gravel.

Vibrant and fresh black fruits with a lovely blueberry fruit freshness on the nose, leads to a palate that is compact with concentrated cassis fruit flavours. There is a lick of cedar oak and the tannins are suave and silky, so much more approachable compared to the more rustic character that this château was renowned for years ago. This is an excellent, value for money claret that will delight the traditional claret drinker.



### Château Beaumont, Haut-Medoc (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 54% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot, 6% Petit Verdot

#### (Neal Martin: 88-90 points) (Decanter 90 Points)

This is a highly regarded Château under the same ownership as Château Beychevelle. Located on the left bank of the Gironde, between the communes of Margaux and Saint-Julien, Château Beaumont draws its finesse and its delicacy from the deep gravels of the best soils of the Haut-Médoc.

Deep and woody on the bouquet with concentrated blackberry fruit aromas. This is a super, high intensity wine, finely crafted with an impressive underbelly of creamy cassis and black olive. There is a crunchy freshness and juiciness that gives balance, the tannins are in check and the finish is full and long. Very impressive.





### **CRU BOURGEOIS EXCEPTIONNELS**

### MÉDOC

Château Potensac (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 48% Cabernet Sauvignon, 35% Merlot, 17% Cabernet Franc £90.00 per case IB

A beautiful estate in the Haut-Médoc situated only 15km from the city of Bordeaux. Owned by Bruno Von der Heyden and Florence Deguillaume, who have invested heavily in the 54 ha of vines and wine cellars over recent years.

The nose expresses a super ripe black fruit intensity, ripe and succulent yet there is an excellent balancing freshness and beautifully singing tannins. This is an impressive wine with a velvety texture that extends right through to the long finish.

### Drink 2027 - 2036

#### MOULIS

Along with Listrac, this appellation tends to be less familiar to buyers than the four major appellations, but does produce some outstanding Cru Bourgeois. The area is situated to the north west of Margaux on a gravelly plain.

The best soils are on the great dune of gravel, stretching from Grand Poujeaux in Moulis, inland through Listrac. It is here where the likes of Château Chasse-Spleen and Château Poujeaux are situated.

### Château Chasse-Spleen (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 57% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 10% Petit Verdot, 3% Cabernet Franc

This renowned property was included in the new Cru Bourgeois Exceptionnel classification in 2003, and rightly so as many think it worthy of Cru Classé status. It is always extremely popular with our En Primeur buyers.

The vineyards were badly affected by hail on the 7th July, with large scale losses, yielding only 33hl/ha. The sturdy Petit Verdot survived the mildew and hail and takes a greater role in the blend this vintage. A dark, dense and richly concentrated wine, it is creamy in texture, smoky, earthy with great depth, some chocolate notes and a richly extracted structure. Cedar oak notes on the finish, this will be a popular wine with lovers of this Château.



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### **CRU BOURGEOIS EXCEPTIONNELS**

### ST-ESTÈPHE

St-Estèphe is the largest producer of the Haut-Médoc appellations, situated at the northern limit of the appellation. It is closest to the mouth of the river Gironde, joining the Atlantic Ocean. Here the richer soil with higher clay content retains moisture well during summer. Wines from the St-Estèphe commune take time to develop but are also very long lived and at their best rival the finest wines of any of the Médoc communes.

#### Château Phelan Segur (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 38% Merlot, 2% Petit Verdot

This 66ha property is a consistent producer of classic St. Estèphe – solid, structured and long-lived. It is situated very close to both Château Montrose and Château Calon-Ségur, so in rather good company! Purchased by Xavier Gardinier in 1985 it is now run by his sons, Thierry and Laurent.

Rich, almost New World in style upon first taste, this Phelan is a layered, complex claret with a firm structure, tight, building tannins, and a dense core of concentrated black forest fruits. The acidity is fresh, and there are notes of spice, capsicum and some graphite. Altogether a rich, brooding Saint-Estèphe



### MARGAUX

This is the largest commune in the Médoc. The lighter, gravelly soils yield some of the most sensual and elegant wines of the Médoc, the complete opposite of Pauillac. The commune is the most southerly of Médoc's appellations and encompasses the neighbouring villages of Cantenac, Arsac, Labarde and Soussans. The 1855 classification includes more wines from Margaux than from any other appellation.

Château Angludet (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 43% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot, 17% Petit Verdot

Owned by the Sichel family and managed since 1989 by Ben, the youngest of the Sichel brothers, this property is blessed with ideal conditions for producing splendidly consistent wines. The sandy and gravelly soil provides good natural drainage, which increases concentration in the fruit.

Now farmed biodynamically, Angludet is producing great wine year on year. Dark and dense in colour, the bouquet is aromatic and forward with an emphasis on raspberry freshness. A solid core of sweet red and black fruits on the initial palate, energised by a delicious freshness. There is elegance here, with pure and precise tannins that support the sweet creamy fruit, interlaced with violet and a hint of vanilla oak. Spicy throughout, this is a polished and vibrant wine that brilliantly reflects the Margaux appellation.



### HAUT-MEDOC

Château La Lagune 5ème Cru Classé Haut-Médoc (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 35% Merlot £165.00 per case IB

(J. Suckling: 94-95 points) (Jane.Anson.com: 93 points)

Situated just below the village of Margaux and next to Château Cantemerle, this has long been a very popular château. Since 2000 La Lagune has been in the hands of the talented Jean-Jacques Frey who is producing excellent wines year after year.

A yield of 30hl/ha, the wine is aged in 50% new oak for 14 months. Lagune has produced quite a profound wine this vintage, brooding and smouldering, with black fruits, plums as well as black olive concentration and a touch of spice. There is a lovely blueberry freshness that provides an excellent equilibrium and the tannins are ripe and chewy. Long and persistent on the finish.



### Château Cantemerle 5ème Cru Classé Haut-Médoc (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 75% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Merlot, 6% Cabernet Franc, 4% Petit Verdot

Situated in the commune of Macau just below the village of Margaux and next to Château La Lagune, this is one of the finest value Growth Clarets. It was the final property to be classified as one of eighteen Cinquièmes Crus (Fifth Growths) in the Bordeaux Wine Official Classification of 1855.

A very impressive, concentrated black fruit laden bouquet, fresh and expressive. The palate is rich, round and creamy, shouting black fruits – blackcurrant, prune and raisin, with soft integrated tannins and notes of cedar oak on the finish. This will no doubt be a real crowd pleaser.



### ST ESTÈPHE

Château Montrose 2ème Cru Classé (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 75% Cabernet Sauvignon, 21% Merlot, 4% Cabernet Franc £714.00 per case IB

Montrose is one of the great traditional names of Bordeaux, always sought-after by En Primeur fans. It was bought in 2006 by the Bouygues family and in recent years an astonishing investment programme has been carried out at the château. Now under the stewardship of Herve Berland, formerly at Mouton Rothschild, this château continues to compete at the very highest level.

Harvested between the 5th - 28th September. The Grand Vin is aged in 60% new oak barrels for 18 months and accounts for 35% of the crop.

This is another magnificent wine from a Château that has been on top form for many years now. In 2023 the first wine was produced from the original terroir of the property known as Terrace 4. A powerful and intense wine, muscular yet finely crafted, showing remarkable purity of cassis fruits, liquorice, graphite and fine pencil shaving notes. The finish is long and very impressive. TOP wine!

### PAUILLAC

The name of Pauillac is assured from the reflected glory of its three First Growths - Lafite, Mouton-Rothschild and Latour, not to mention the other fifteen Cru Classé Châteaux situated in the commune. The wines, produced from vineyards that sit on a generally heavy gravel soil with varying sub-soils, are among the most powerful and well structured in the whole of the Bordeaux region.

#### Château Duhart-Milon Rothschild 4ème Cru Classé (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 80% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot

Another Rothschild property produced by the team that makes Lafite. Duhart is always a high achiever. This 46-hectare estate is ever increasing its reputation for excellent, consistent quality, producing great wines over recent vintages.

A very impressive, concentrated black fruit laden bouquet, fresh and expressive. The palate is rich, round and creamy, shouting black fruits – blackcurrant, prune and raisin, with soft integrated tannins and notes of cedar oak on the finish. This will no doubt be a real crown pleaser.



### Château Clerc Milon 5ème Cru Classé (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 72% Cabernet Sauvignon, 19% Merlot, 6.5% Cabernet Franc, 1.5% Carmenere, 1% Petit Verdot

Part of the Mouton Rothschild stable and made by the same winemaking team. Aged in 55% new oak barrels for 18 months.

A big, dark and muscular Pauillac, showing hints of raspberry, pomegranate over a core of dense cassis and sweet lack cherry fruit. An enigmatic note of bruised apple and forest floor gives a lovely counterpoint to the black fruit, and the tannins, considerable that they are, show elegance and a roundness to the structure. Very good - classic Pauillac!



### PAUILLAC

### Château d'Armailhac 5ème Cru Classé (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 70% Cabernet Sauvignon, 15% Merlot, 13% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot

Formerly known as Château Mouton Baron Philippe this excellent property is still owned by the Rothschild family and is one to follow.

A smoky rich bouquet with notes of cherry, cedar oak and tobacco. This is a well structured wine showing black berry fruits, firm tannins, sweet oak and a summer pudding freshness. A delicious claret.



### Château Grand-Puy-Lacoste 5ème Cru Classé (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 77% Cabernet Sauvignon, 23% Merlot

Owned by the Borie family, this 45-hectare property has a reputation for producing excellent, full-bodied Pauillac.

This top Pauillac property has performed very well in 2023. The 23% Merlot shows an uplifted, forward nose of rich mocha fruit and hint of cassis, plum and raspberry. The palate is charming, beautifully refined and elegant, layers of vibrant red and black fruits, pencil, black olive, sweet vanilla oak and some jam. The tannins are soft at first, then tighten considerably on the finish. Fresh throughout.

Drink 2033 - 2045

In this battle, the French re-conquered the neighbouring Chateau Latour from the English, a crucial point in the history of Aquitaine. A ripe and powerful claret, showing the benefit of investment in both vineyard and cellars. Dark and dense in colour, slightly oily on the rim. The bouquet is forward, very ripe and sweet, with notes of red cherry, raspberry coulis and a hint of dark chocolate. This is an elegant and refined wine showing deep and dark fruits, black cherry, plum and a layer of cassis. The fruit is vivid and bright, with balancing acidity and light oak. The tannins are tight and firm, but the fruit will swell over the next few years. A bold and expressive wine.

### SATELLITE ST EMILION

Situated just to the north and northeast of Saint-Emilion are four separate appellations know as the 'St Emilion satellites'. They are Lussac-Saint-Emilion, Montagne-Saint-Emilion, Puisseguin-Saint-Emilion, and Saint-Georges-Saint-Emilion, Here the temperatures are a little cooler than in St. Emilion as the region is further from the Dordogne which means the harvesting is a little later. This is a great source of value for money wines, especially in top vintages.

### Château Corbin, Montagne St Emilion (6x75cl)£42.00 per case IBGrape Mix: 75% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Franc, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Malbec

Overlooking both Cheval Blanc and Pétrus, this is a beautifully located, family owned château that produces outstanding, affordable claret. It is one of the oldest properties in Montagne which in itself is the smallest appellation in the Bordeaux region with only 18 growers. Dating back to the 16th Century the property has 23ha of vines that surround the Château. Jacques Rambaud took over from his father in 2005.

This is a hidden jewel of a Château, offering some of the finest value for money on the Right Bank. Aged in 40% old barrels and 60% in tank, Jacques Rambaud includes a small proportion of Malbec in the blend, which is co-fermented with Cabernet Franc. Packed with intense, stewed plums and ripe mulberry fruits, this is so suave and fruity. There is a lovely velvety feel to the palate with a crunchy freshness and mineral edge and the tannins are beautifully polished. This wine is a wonderful representation of the terroir and character of Montagne-Saint Emilon.

### Château du Courlat, Lussac St Emilion (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 95% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc

From the long driveway of Cyprus trees on your approach, this estate inspires peace and tranquillity. Nature is present at every turn, with a large lake at the centre of vines, forest and Château.

Dark violet in colour, this is a super ripe Merlot dominant wine. Vibrant, fresh and aromatic with oodles of blackcurrant jam fruit, rich and moreish and yummy chewy tannins. Absolutely sumptuous, this is a great everyday drinker.

Château du Courlat Cuvee Jean-Baptiste, Lussac St Emilion (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 100% Merlot

#### (Jane.Anson.com: 92 points)

In honour of Pierre Bourotte's Grand-father, Jean-Baptiste Audy, this is a wine of power and depth, produced from the oldest Merlot vines of the property grown on a deep clay soil.

Dark purple in colour, the nose is dense, full of blackcurrant aromas and a light smattering of oak. The palate is incredibly concentrated and ripe, with blackberry coulis, stewed prunes and cherry liqueur, but there is also a delightful freshness which provides perfect balance. This is one to note.

### **ST EMILION**

On the right bank of Bordeaux, this is a large appellation where the Merlot grape dominates on the clay and limestone soils. Here the wines are rich and sumptuous. For those who like ballet dancing, head for the Médoc. For those who like belly dancing, this is the place for you!

St Emilion wines were not included in the 1855 Bordeaux classification with the first classification made in 1954. Unlike the 1855 classification, the St Emilion classification is regularly revised.

#### Château Fonplegade, Grand Cru St Emilion (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 85% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Franc

The impressive 18.5ha property, situated close to the famous Château Angelus, belongs to American Denise Adams who, with the advice of Michel Rolland and Stéphane Derenoncourt is now producing one of the best value for money Grand Crus in St.Emilion, using bio-dynamic farming principles.

Produced biodynamically. Aged for between 16 and 18 months in 50% new French oak barrels, 30% one year barrels, 10% cement eggs and 10% amphora.

2023 is another super result. An expansive, rich and fragrant bouquet, the palate is bursting with compact and concentrated, voluptuous black fruit flavours, beautifully polished and well defined tannins and a rich and long finish.



### Château Grand Mayne, Grand Cru St Emilion (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 75% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Franc

Located north-west of the town of St-Emilion, this château was built in 1767 and since 1934 has been owned and run by the Nony family with Jean-Pierre Nony at the helm since 1975. With 19 hectares of vineyards, the château is superbly sited on the edge of a limestone plateau, where the soils are rich in clay, limestone and iron.

Grand Mayne is one of the stars of the appellation this vintage - dark, dense and smoky on the nose, lush black fruits combining with a fragrant red cherry note. The wine is intense, charming and pure, building with firming tannins and a note of cocoa powder and raspberry, balanced by a fine freshness. Powerful, concentrated and rounded on the finish.





### POMEROL

Pomerol is the smallest of the major Bordeaux appellations. It is only 3 kilometers by 4 kilometers in dimension, with only 800 hectares under vine and around 150 châteaux. Whilst Pomerol is the home to some of the most sought after wines in the world, unlike other Bordeaux regions, it has no official wine classification. With soils of blue clay, the wines produced are sensual, rich and alluring.

### Château Les Hauts-Conseillants (12x75cl) Grape Mix: 95% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc

#### (Jane.Anson.com: 91 points)

Located in Lalande de Pomerol, just across from Pomerol itself, the 10 hectare Château Les Hauts-Conseillants is owned and managed by the Bourotte family. Like some of the best soils in Pomerol, Les Hauts-Conseillants lies on a clay/gravel bed mixed with sand and produces a consistently full bodied plummy wine.

Destemmed 100%. Fermented plot by plot in small stainless and cement vats with manual pumping over and punching of the caps. The wine is aged for 18 months in fine-grained French oak barrels (30% new)

This is a magnificent result, given the viticultural challenges in June 2023. A charming Merlot rich wine, velvety in texture, full of concentrated black fruits and juicy plums with a delicious raspberry freshness. The tannins are subdued and supporting and the finish is intense.



### Château Bonalgue (6x75cl) Grape Mix: 95% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc

Originally built by one of Napoleon's officers on his return from the Egyptian campaign over 200 years ago this property covers 7 hectares with an ideal exposure. Owned by the Bourotte family, this excellent property covers 7 hectares with an ideal exposure, producing classic Pomerol.

Destemmed 100%. Yields of 35hl/ha. Fermentation is carried out plot by plot, in small stainless and cement vats with manual pumping over and punching of the caps. The malolactic fermentation took place in barrel. Aged for 18 months in fine-grained French oak barrels (50% new).

A super Pomerol, rich in moreish, ripe prune fruit, soft and creamy with a voluptuous mouthfeel. Layer upon layer of dark cherry jam, mocha and coffee notes fill the mouth. The tannins are powerful and intense, yet not overpowering, and there is a wonderful freshness that gives a beautiful balance.

Yields of 40hl/ha. Fermentation caried out plot by plot, in small stainless and cement vats with manual pumping over and punching of the caps. The malolactic fermentation took place in barrel. Aged for 18 months in fine-grained French oak barrels, 50% new.

A fantastic follow-on to a stupendous 2022. Rich and ripe on the nose, with a careful level of extraction. The palate is full, densely bound with mocha, cherry, kirsch and crunchy blackcurrant notes, diffused with dusty cocoa and some minerality and graphite. The tannins are firm, not unyielding but robust enough to hold the fruit and balancing acidity.

A yield of only 26hl/ha with ageing in 30% new oak barrels for 16 monthd. Plump, elegant and smoky, dialled down from the chewy, oak dominated wines of previous vintages. This Rouget is elegance personified, but with the signature Pomerol notes of lush sweet mocha, cherry and plum fruit, cut through with a refined acidity and touch of pepper and liquorice. Generous, rich and rounded.
